You may apply to Cornell College using our paper application or online at www.cornellcollege.edu/apply.

Your Admission Checklist

- ❑ Submit your application by December 1 to have your \$30 application fee waived.
- ❑ If applying after December 1, please enclose the \$30 application fee.
- ❑ Submit the School Report form to your school counselor. Transfer students should submit the Dean's Reference Form.
- ❑ Request that a transcript be sent from your high school and any college in which you are or have been enrolled.
- ❑ ACT or SAT I scores are required. Cornell's ACT code is 1296 and the SAT is 6119. (Scores submitted on your transcript are also acceptable.) SAT II tests will be included in our review of an admission candidacy; however, they are not required.
- ❑ While the teacher recommendation is optional, students are encouraged to have a teacher from the junior or senior year submit a recommendation.

Early Decision 1 (ED 1) – November 1 If Cornell is your first choice we encourage you to apply for our binding Early Decision (ED 1) plan. By applying ED 1 by November 1, you will receive a waiver of your \$30 application fee, immediate admission and scholarship review, and preliminary financial aid estimates. Review of completed ED 1 applications begins October 1. Applicants admitted to the College who wish to enroll must submit a \$300 non-refundable deposit, postmarked by January 15. Upon submission of the deposit to Cornell students must withdraw applications to all other schools.

Early Action (EA) – December 1 If you would like to learn of your admission status early, you must postmark your application by December 1 for our non-binding Early Action (EA) plan. Review of completed EA applications begins mid-October and will continue through February 1. By applying EA, you are eligible to receive a waiver of the \$30 application fee, priority admission and scholarship consideration, and preliminary financial aid estimates. Applicants who are offered admission and wish to enroll must submit a \$300 deposit by May 1.

Regular Decision (RD) – February 1 Review of completed applications begins January 1 and will continue through April 1. Applicants admitted through this non-binding plan must submit a \$300 deposit by May 1.

Early Decision 2 (ED 2) – February 1 Review of completed ED 2 applications begins January 1 and will continue through March 1. This ED 2 option allows students to submit a 7th semester transcript or a later SAT/ACT score with their application materials. Applicants admitted to the College who wish to enroll must submit a \$300 non-refundable deposit, postmarked by April 1. Upon submission of the deposit to Cornell students must withdraw applications to all other schools.

Transfer Admission – March 1 (Fall); December 1 (Spring) Students applying as transfers who submit all required application materials postmarked by March 1 are given priority consideration for admission and transfer scholarships. Applicants admitted as transfers who wish to enroll must submit a \$300 deposit postmarked by May 1. Applications arriving after May 1 are considered on a space-available basis. Transfer students interested in enrolling for the spring semester are encouraged to apply by December 1.

Each year, a number of students apply for admission following the junior year of high school. Some may be graduating early; others may be willing to forego the senior year to begin college early. International Students – February 1

International applications mailed by December 1 will receive priority consideration in our regular decision processing and possibly earlier notification of our decision. Scholarship Opportunities

Cornell offers attractive merit-based and talent-based scholarships ranging from \$1,000 to \$20,000.
