These courses are an option for students who wish to achieve greater fluency and an understanding of life in a Francophone country. Students will develop and refine their intermediate language skills, but rather than stay on campus, they will study and learn French in a French-speaking environment. Many course assignments will take place out of a traditional classroom setting, and students will be required to interact with native speakers every day. The majority of this course will be taught in France. Students will spend most of the course living with host families in a smaller French city and be fully immersed in local life. Students wishing to stay in Europe at the end of the course should speak with Prof. Baty and the off-campus studies office regarding logistics.
