

FOREIGN POLICY POWERS UNDER THE CONSTITUTION

President:

1. Commander in Chief
2. commission all officers
3. receive ambassadors

President and Senate:

1. appoint ambassadors
2. make treaties

Congress (presidential veto and congressional override):

1. impose duties
2. provide for the common defense
3. regulate commerce with foreign nations
4. establish a rule of naturalization
5. regulate the value of foreign coin
6. define & punish piracies & felonies committed on the high seas & offenses against the Law of Nations
7. declare war
8. grant letters of marque & reprisal
9. make rules concerning captures on land & water
10. raise & support armies
11. provide & maintain a navy
12. provide for calling forth the militia to repel invasions
13. prescribe training of militia
14. make all laws which shall be necessary and proper for carrying into execution the foregoing powers and all other powers vested by this constitution in the United States, or in any department or officer thereof
