





Welcome to Cornell College!

We are located in Mount Vernon, Iowa, a small town situated between Iowa City and Cedar Rapids, two thriving cities that are economic and cultural hubs of the state. We are also located within a four-hour drive of major metropolitan areas of Chicago, Minneapolis, and St. Louis. Mount Vernon is a progressive community committed to embracing diversity and engaging with our college residents. In fact, our Campus Safety Office works closely with the local police department to ensure a safe environment for you on and off campus, and several of our students engage with the local emergency service as volunteer EMTs.

Cornell is a residential campus, which means that you will be living on campus with more than 90% of the student body in campus housing. You will be within an easy walk of all campus facilities including the dining hall, student health staff, mental health staff, library, academic buildings, parking, and student support services.

All residence halls have locks keyed to your student ID and feature amenities that include free laundry machines, group study rooms, common gathering spaces, and kitchenettes for personal meal preparation. Most rooms are double occupancy, and you will be expected to share with a roommate (who could end up being a best friend for life).

Academics

Cornell offers you the choice of over 60 programs of study including pre-professional programs for health professions and law. You can think ahead to a master's degree with a partnered pathway program in accounting, finance, information science, law, and public health. Are you ambitious? We offer a B.S.S. degree and individualized major options that allow you to create a custom experience based on your personal future goals.

Cornell College is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission, an institutional accreditation agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. The college is also accredited by the University Senate of the United Methodist Church and is a member of the College Entrance Examination Board. Individual academic programs at Cornell College are accredited by the Iowa State Department of Education, and the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET). In addition, Cornell College has been approved by the American Chemical Society (ACS) for the professional training of chemistry students.

Our Course of Study

Formally it's called **One Course At A Time**. Our nicknames for it—
One Course and the block plan. It's what makes us different from most colleges. And it's why our students say, "I can do anything in 18 days."

You pick 1 course. You spend 18 days studying a subject—and only that subject—every day, Monday through Friday. You can take a block for research, study abroad, or an internship without any conflicts. Each block, you get to know your 1 professor who is teaching only 1 course and you get to know your classmates and they get to know you. Then you take 4 days off during block break and then you start all over again with your next course.

With 8 blocks (8 courses) a year, you will complete the same academic load that you would at other colleges and earn your degree in the same 4-year timeframe.

Midway through your sophomore year, you'll define or declare your major (or majors!) and maybe even a minor.

US F-1 Student Visa Tips

1. Before Your Appointment

- ☑ Receive I-20 from Cornell College
- ☑ Pay the I-901 SEVIS fee
- ☑ Complete the DS-160 and pay the fee
- ☑ Schedule Visa appointment with local Embassy or Consulate


2. What To Bring With You

- ☑ I-20 Form, signed
- ☑ Both I-901 Receipt and DS-160 Receipt and barcode page
- ☑ Valid passport
- ☑ Transcripts from previous studies
- Official test scores (SAT, ACT, TOEFL, IELTS, Duolingo, or others)
- ☑ Proof of financial support (bank statement)

3. Be Prepared

- ☑ Do your research
- ☑ Speak in English
- ☑ Be prepared to demonstrate nonimmigrant intent
- ☑ Be honest!
