

FRENCH

This document is a tool approved by the department as a complete and accurate checklist for 2018-2019 Catalogue. Students who are meeting requirements with other courses than listed below must ask their advisor to file the waiver/substitution form (<http://www.cornellcollege.edu/registrar/gb-resources-faculty>). Students are expected to complete the major and minor requirements that were in effect at the time of Spring registration for their second year of courses. Transfer students who are admitted with sophomore or higher standing satisfy the requirements in effect when they begin their first course at Cornell. Students who have withdrawn from Cornell and are later readmitted follow the requirements in effect at the time of their readmission. Exceptions may be made by the department concerned in response to the student's petition, provided that such changes are feasible for and agreeable to the department.

Four additional electives in French above the 205 level, with the following possible exceptions: The four electives may include a maximum of two upper-level courses (200 or above) taken from other programs/departments, approved beforehand by the French program as relevant to the major. Up to two 200- or 300-level courses offered by the French program but taught in English may count as electives if approved beforehand by the French program. In any combination, no more than two of these four electives may be courses taught in a language other than French.

Two additional electives in French above the 205 level, with the following possible exceptions: The two electives may include a maximum of one upper-level (200 or above) course taken from another program/department, approved beforehand by the French program as relevant to the minor. Similarly, one 200- or 300-level course offered by the French program but taught in English may count as an elective if approved beforehand by the French program. Either way, a total of no more than one of these two electives may be a course taught in a language other than French.
