Explanation of Transcripts

ACCREDITATION: Cornell College is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools, the Iowa State Department of Education, the American Chemical Society, and the University Senate of the United Methodist Church.

COURSE CREDIT: Since September 1963 1.0 credit equals 4 semester hours or 6 quarter hours. Transfer courses not equivalent to specific Cornell College courses are numbered 01X for 100 level, 02X for 200 level, and 03X for a 300 level course.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR: September 1978 through August 2016 the academic year is called Full and is named by the year in which it begins, including all courses completed between the fall start date and end of following spring. Beginning September 2016 the academic calendar is based on the semester system divided into a Fall and a Spring semester.

ONE-COURSE-AT-A-TIME-PLAN: Effective September 1978, students take one principal course for 3 1/2 weeks, or 18 class days, for eigh terms (nine terms prior to 2012). Adjunct courses (numbered in the 500s or 700s) usually involve at least 4 terms (a semester) and are taken in conjunction with principal or concurrent courses.

GRADING SYSTEM: A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+, C, C-, D+, D, D-, P, S and CR are passing grades. F, NC, and U denote failure. AU indicates a course audited for no credit. I indicates work of satisfactory quality which is "Incomplete." W signifies withdrawal, and may appear alone, followed by the grade the student has earned at the time of withdrawal (prior to September 1974), by H if for reasons of health or personal emergency, or by R if by default for non-attendance. IP indicates a course in progress or grade not reported. A repeated course, indicated by 'R' (after the course), or by a grade in brackets [], carries graduation credit only when specified in the course description.

Effective September 1972

4 point scale used for quality points:

A = 4, A = 3.7, B = 3.3, B = 3, B = 2.7,

C+ = 2.3, C = 2, C- = 1.7, D+ = 1.3, D = 1, D- = .7, F = 0.

No points are assigned for P, S, U, CR, or NC.

Effective February 1965

4 point scale used for quality points:

A = 4, B = 3, C = 2, D = 1, F = 0. All subsequent grades reflect this change and cumulative averages

computed after this date are on the 4 point scale.

Prior to February 1965

3 point scale used for quality points:

A = 3, B = 2, C = 1, D = 0, F = -1.

CR/NC

CR (Credit) and NC (No Credit) are not a grading option exercised by the student except for courses so designated in the catalogue. CR signifies work of C quality or better; NC, failure.

S/U

S (Satisfactory) and U (Unsatisfactory) were a student grading option between September 1970 and May 1976. S was equivalent to a C- or higher. Neither grade was computed in the grade point average. This option was reestablished as of the 2013 academic year with S being

equivalent to a C or higher.

P/F P (Pass) and F (Failure) were a student grading option from September 1968 to May 1970. P was the equivalent of D or higher and was not computed in the grade point average, but F was.
